The ARID stewardship table is included in this section. The table shows the natural and cultural resources present at the range or UXO-DMM-MC site.

The ASR for this site reported that several threatened and endangered species are known to exist within Fort McClellan. This includes Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*), endangered; Gray Bat (*Myotis grisescens*), endangered; red-cockaded woodpecker (*Picoides borealis*), endangered; Tennessee yellow-eyed grass (*Xyris tennesseensis*), endangered; pygmy sculpin (*Cottus pygmaeus*), threatened; blue shiner (*Cyprinella caerulea*), threatened; Tulotoma snail (*Tulotoma magnifica*), endangered; fine-lined pocketbook (*Lampsilis altilis*), threatened; Mohr's Barbara's Buttons (*Marchillia mohrii*), threatened; and southern pigtoe (*Pleurobema georgianum*), endangered.

Tables J-1 through J-4 provide brief summaries of known ranges at Fort McClellan. These have been divided into four risk categories: CWM, HE, training and materials, and small arms ranges.
